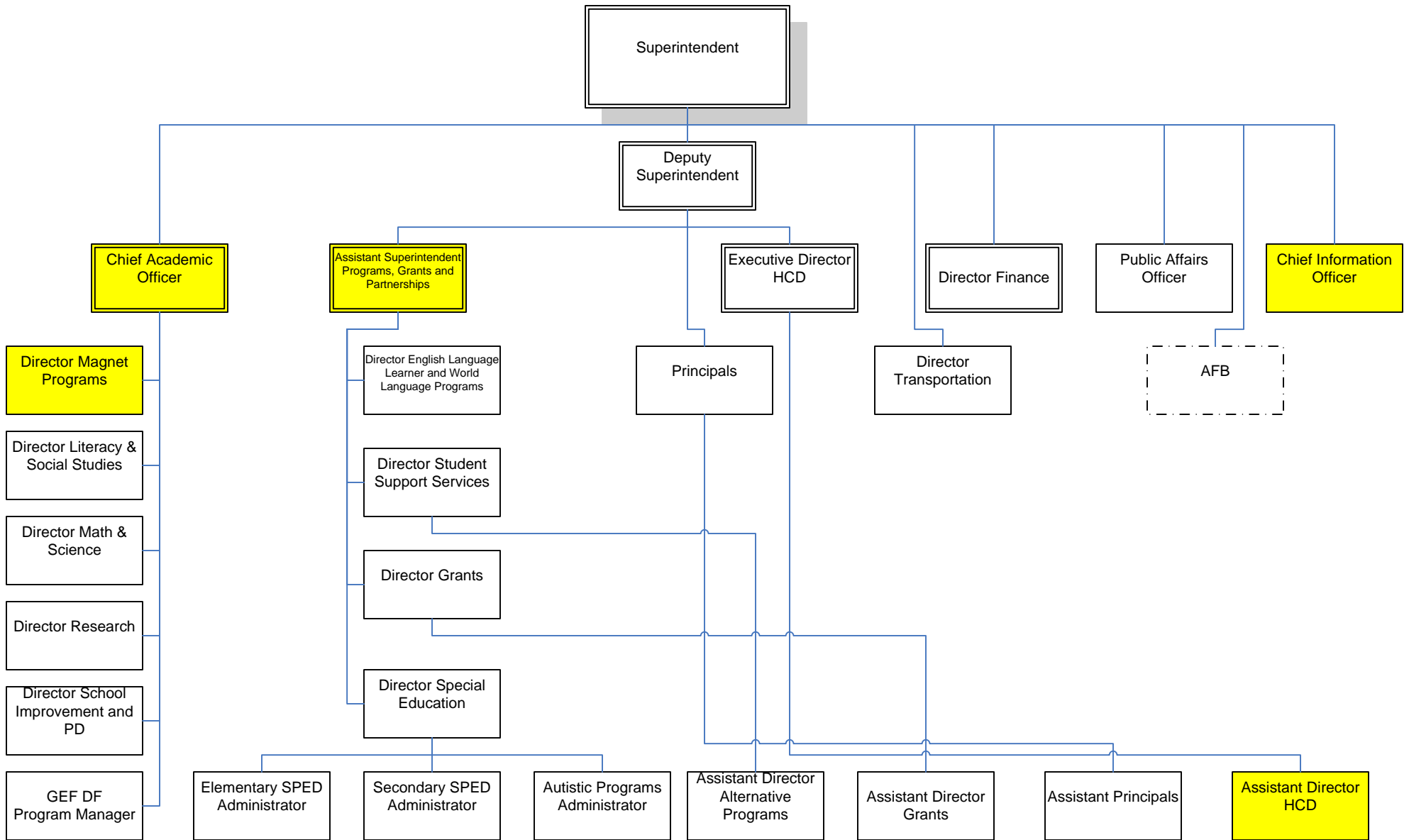
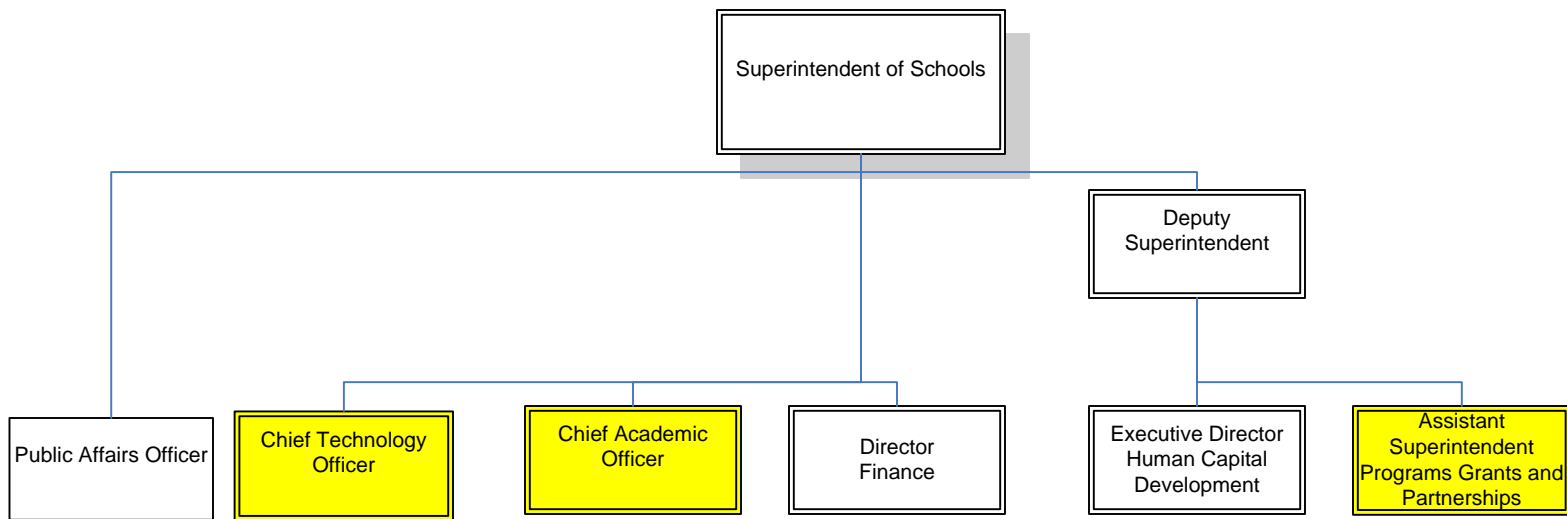


2010-11 Central Office Administrators Organization Chart



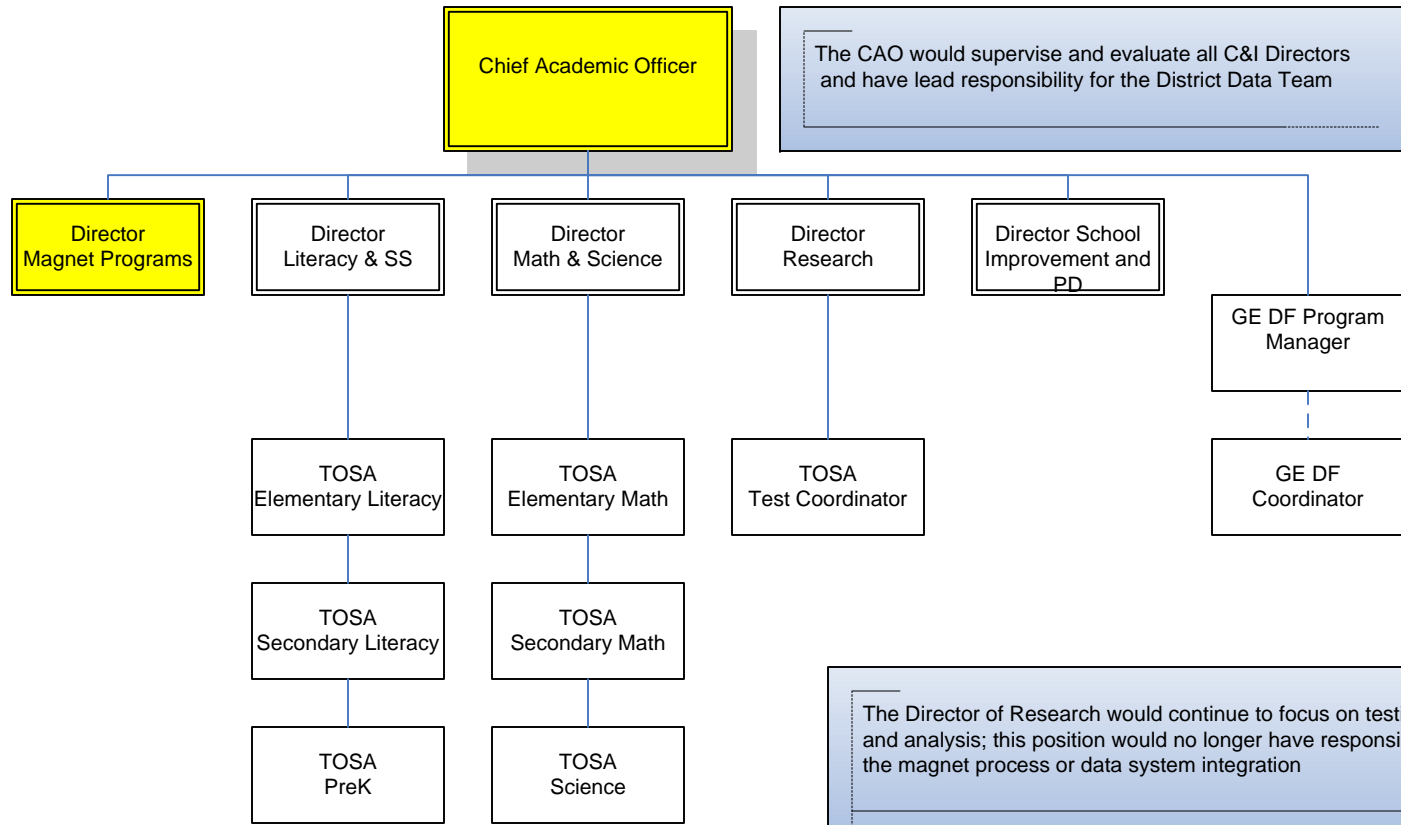
All new positions are replacements for current positions and/or are fully grant funded

2010-11 Cabinet Organization Chart



The Chief Technology Officer position is fully grant funded. The major responsibilities include oversight of all data systems and information technology in the district.

2010-11 Curriculum and Instruction Organization Chart



The CAO would supervise and evaluate all C&I Directors and have lead responsibility for the District Data Team

The Director of Research would continue to focus on testing/assessment and analysis; this position would no longer have responsibility for the magnet process or data system integration

The Director of Magnet Programs would supervise magnet schools and oversee the magnet lottery process

Directors of Literacy/SS and Math/Science would continue to oversee K-12 curriculum revision, development and implementation and would jointly supervise school improvement efforts at approximately four schools

The Director of School Improvement and Professional Development Would continue to oversee all School Improvement and PD efforts and directly supervise school improvement efforts at approximately four schools

Evaluations of principals would be done by the Deputy Superintendent. Supervision of schools involves regular coaching and monitoring of school improvement efforts. Schools would be categorized by their needs, as determined by CMT/CAPT, NCLB status, survey data and status of school improvement/curriculum implementation.

None of these positions are new; the Research office would be reorganized to focus on testing and assessment, staff would be reassigned to administer the magnet lottery.

The Elementary Math TOSA is a fully grant funded reinstatement of a previous position.
